Essential Job Functions

- Officiate intramural contests for various sports.
- Possess thorough knowledge of Intramural Sports and Officials' Handbooks.
- Attend all mandatory trainings and meetings.
- Adhere to and enforce safety guidelines and policies.
- Complete all necessary paperwork.
- Effectively communicate to fellow staff members, participants, and spectators in a professional manner regarding UC Intramural Sports.
- Assist with facility set-up and tear down.
- Conduct and/or assist with daily cleaning operations.
- Abide by all staff policies, procedures, and guidelines as communicated from training week.
- Procure concussion recognition certification and handle situations involving suspected concussions.
- Assist in the overall marketing of the Intramural Sports program.
- Other duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications

- At least 16 years of age
- Enrolled at a post-secondary institution or a secondary school at least part-time (one (1) or
- more credit hours if at a post-secondary institution), except for summer term, or will be a
- registered student during the next academic term
- Clery Certification
- Fire Extinguisher Certification
- NFHS Concussion in Sports Certification
- American Red Cross CPR/AED for Professional Rescuers with First Aid
